All aspiring and current neurologists deserve an academic and professional environment that is inclusive and free of discrimination so they can thrive in their chosen profession.

Systemic racism, sexism, ableism, and other forces affect access to neurologic care, the generalizability of research, and the professional prospects of aspiring neurologists and neuroscientists. In 2020, under the direction of Dr. Justin McArthur in his role of President, the ANA established a Task Force to pursue his vision for the ANA to create and foster a culture of diversity, equity, and inclusion. The work of the task force was effective and extremely valued, so in 2022, the task force became the Inclusion/Diversity/ Equity/Anti-Racism/Social Justice (IDEAS) Committee. The committee continues to develop best practices for our members and the field of academic neurology. The committee serves as a resource for ANA leadership to provide feedback, work on DEI-related professional development and trainings, select award recipients, create opportunities for dialogue, and assess the ANA's progress toward DEI goals.

2023 has been an incredible year for the American Neurological Association (ANA) in so many ways. The ANA Executive Committee and board did incredible work in 2022 to begin building a team who will directly serve the ANA into the future. We began 2023 with ANA's new CEO, Brenda Orffer, CAE, in place and appointing Dr. Nadine Goldberg as Chief Program Officer. As the year progressed, we added Jennifer Summers, Meetings Logistics Manager, and Diana Hitchings, Controller to our growing team.

As our staff increased, the ability to support ANA's committees, projects, goals, and objectives has become stronger. During 2023, we saw the appointment of a new President-Elect, Secretary, and four Directors on the ANA Board of Directors. In addition, the ANA established a Clinical Affairs Committee and a Finance Committee, and seated approximately 40 new individuals to various ANA committees to help us advance our mission.

Our goals in 2023 included restructuring and reimagining our organization. Our primary objectives included expanding our reach and brand, increasing membership, enhancing programming, and continued excellence in the ANA journals. We worked to advance the ANA's global impact through initiatives spearheaded by the Global Engagement Committee, continued to provide an outstanding Annual Meeting experience for attendees by increasing our educational program offerings and networking opportunities, grew membership, and expanded our brand through connection with stakeholders. Throughout the year, we worked toward these goals and are proud to say that we accomplished much.

- The ANA awarded \$8,000 in funding through the Grant to Activate Global Engagement (GAGE) to support projects in low and lower-middle income countries. These funds were used to provide education and training including the Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias in Zambia (ADDIZ) Symposium in Zambia, the Guinean Society of Neurology's first National Scientific Symposium on Epilepsy, the Bahir Dar Outreach for Neurology Education (BORNE) Symposium and the Stroke Diagnosis and Management in a Resource-limited Setting Symposium in Uganda.
- The ANA provided a total of \$20,000 to neurological organizations in Ghana, Nigeria, Uganda and Zambia for the development of junior and early career investigators as a result of the Presidential Global Neurology Initiative started by Dr. Frances Jensen. Each organization developed programs in collaboration with ANA and funds were utilized to provide early career investigators with research grants, educational and professional development resources.
- The ANA recognized several individuals for outstanding research and achievements through its 2023 Awards Program. Award winners were recognized at the Annual Meeting in Philadelphia in September. <u>CLICK HERE FOR AWARD WINNERS</u>
- ANA2023 was an outstanding event hosted in Philadelphia in September. With a record number of abstracts, 1,031 registrations, and additional educational programming, ANA2023 received rave reviews by attendees, sponsors, and exhibitors. The media coverage of science and research shared at the meeting was excellent. <u>VIEW THE FINAL PROGRAM</u>
- The ANA launched an initial meeting of subspecialty groups in August. With more than 15 participating organizations, this meeting resulted in identifying common challenges, areas of opportunity, and potential collaboration among various subspecialties.
- The ANA hosted its first Academia-Industry Workshop at the New York Academy of Sciences in November with a focus on drug development and clinical trials with an emphasis on Alzheimer's Disease. Proceedings from the event will be published in the *Annals of Neurology* and shared with ANA members. <u>VIEW THE FINAL PROGRAM</u>
- ANA Membership increased with institutional program membership and through outreach to recruit other new members. The renewal rate for 2023 was 83%, an increase over the renewal rate of 70% in 2022.
- Throughout 2023, the ANA has celebrated heritage months to honor the contributions individuals have made to neurology, medicine, and science through the observation of heritage months.

We are grateful for our members, leaders, Board of Directors, and staff who help us work toward our mission of advancing science, education, and careers to improve neurologic health for all. We continue to strive toward our vision of a world without neurological disease and appreciate every contribution from our members to support this important work.





COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN OF MANUSCRIPTS SUBMITTED:






Annals of Neurology Initiatives


ACTN Initiatives





The main sources of income to the ANA are membership dues, annual meeting registrations, publication revenues for *Annals of Neurology* and *Annals of Clinical and Translational Neurology*, and commercial support from sponsors and exhibitors for our meetings. Our main expenses continue to be providing high quality meetings that meet the needs of our members and their trainees, publication costs for the journals, and administrative costs associated with those activities. Balancing the expenses with our income sources can at times be challenging, but we are committed to providing high quality publications, meetings, and support for academic neurology, in a sustainable balance.

The ANA is currently building an administrative team and moving away from utilizing an association management company so that we will be a stand-alone organization. This process has incurred some one-time expenses that we expect will be done by the end of 2024. The ANA Board of Directors, Finance Committee, and staff continue to work together to safeguard the financial resources of the ANA, identify cost savings, recruit additional members, and explore new support opportunities to ensure financial stability to support the strategic goals and objectives of the ANA.


HERITAGE MONTHS
